

#### Day 1

#### Inauguration of the NSS Special camp at Budharopet

National service scheme is the scheme launched by ministry of youth affairs to involve the youth in various educations to serve the society. The caption of NSS is NOT ME BUT YOU.

With the special interest of our Honourable MLA Peddi Sudharshan Reddy garu and by following the orders of NSS coordinator of Kakatiya University Dr. Eesam Narayana garu we have decided to conduct the special at Budharopet. To the inauguration function was held at Gram panchayat office Budharopet. The program was inaugurated by the Sarpanch of the village by jyothi prajwalana and followed by prayer song. Program officer Mr.T.Ashwin Kumar has explained the schedule for the seven days special camp and seeked the help of gram panchayat people for conducting the camp. He extended his appreciation to the volunteers for showing their interest in participating the camp. While addressing the gathering sarpanch has said that NSS is the very good scheme to service the people, he appreciated and extended happiness to the NSS unit of Jayamukhi College of pharmacy for choosing their village for special camp. He promised that he will extend all the support needed. College management Mr.Shankar reddy garu addressed the gathering and said that students has to be very disciplined and should serve the village while doing activities. Director of the college Dr.C.Veeresham has said that these types of camps inculcate many leadership qualities in the students. it also builds good manners and capability to serve the society whenever there is a need. Principal of the college Dr.S Vasudeva murthy has said that students and volunteers get more knowledge about the people living in the villages their living style and facilities at their places, and they also learn about handling the situations.

Volunteers also felt very happy and they showed a active involvement in the camp. Post lunch volunteers were given training about the activities and how to execute the work from the next day.

#### Day 2

#### Importance of hand wash and precautions to be taken during summer season:

After corona effect the Hand wash is gained more importance. Whenever we come from outside its a custom in Indian culture to wash your hand and feet which prevents the microbes to enter the surroundings. There are 7 steps involved in the process of hand wash. Mostly children of the age below tend to play with the sand and touch the floor frequently where micro organisms and abundant. When the children don't wash their hands or put the same in their mouth it becomes the major source of spread of diseases. Our NSS volunteers visited the primary school and

interacted with the students and explained them various ways of washing hand and also explained the importance of hand wash to children.

As the camp was conducted in the month of April volunteers has visited many homes and explained about the precautions to be taken during summer season. People under go severe dehydration during summer which causes loss of salts and electrolytes from the body. There is also a chance of getting sun stroke if the people are exposed to the hot sun for more time. Volunteers have explained the consequences and how to overcome these situations.

#### Day 3

#### **Swachh Bharat**

Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, or Clean India Mission is a country-wide campaign initiated by the Government of India in 2014 to eliminate open defecation and improve solid waste management. Initiated by the Government of India, the mission aimed to achieve an "open-defecation free" (ODF) India by 2 October 2019, the 150th anniversary of the birth of Mahatma Gandhi through construction of toilets. An estimated 89.9 million toilets were built in the period. The objectives of the first phase of the mission also included eradication of manual scavenging, generating awareness and bringing about a behavior change regarding sanitation practices, and augmentation of capacity at the local level.

The second phase of the mission aims to sustain the open defecation free status and improve the management of solid and liquid waste, while also working to improve the lives of sanitation workers. The mission is aimed at progressing towards target 6.2 of the Sustainable Development Goals Number 6 established by the United Nations in 2015.

Our NSS unit has decided to conduct this program in the village. Volunteers distributed into groups and with the help of the panchayat workers they have cleaned the roads and colonies of the village. They also explained about the Swachh bharat mission.

#### Day 4

#### Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an emergency procedure consisting of chest compressions often combined with artificial ventilation in an effort to manually preserve intact brain function until further measures are taken to restore spontaneous blood circulation and breathing in a person who is in cardiac arrest. It is recommended in those who are unresponsive with no breathing or abnormal breathing, for example, agonal respirations.

CPR involves chest compressions for adults between 5 cm (2.0 in) and 6 cm (2.4 in) deep and at a rate of at least 100 to 120 per minute. The rescuer may also provide artificial ventilation by

either exhaling air into the subject's mouth or nose (mouth-to-mouth resuscitation) or using a device that pushes air into the subject's lungs (mechanical ventilation).

CPR alone is unlikely to restart the heart. Its main purpose is to restore partial flow of oxygenated blood to the brain and heart. The objective is to delay tissue death and to extend the brief window of opportunity for a successful resuscitation without permanent brain damage. In general, CPR is continued until the person has a return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) or is declared dead.

Our NSS unit in association with Srinivasa heart foundation has conducted the CPR program in the village and explained how CPR is performed. The founder of Srinivasa heart foundation Dr.Ramaka Srinivas has provided us the mannequin which are very much helpful to explain the process. As our volunteers are well trained with the Doctor they are able to explain the process of CPR. Villagers showed interest in learning the process.

#### Day 5

#### Carrier guidance to model school children

Model school was located in the interior of the village has 1000 students perusing schooling and intermediate education. Most of them are from remote places and lack the knowledge about various carriers and higher education to peruse. As most of them were in the adolescent stage their mind tend to be attracted to bad habits very fast. These students need proper counselling to get into right path. Jayamukhi college of Pharmacy Research director Dr.Ciddi Veersham who is the retired professor from Kakatiya University has interacted with the students and explained about the various carrier opportunities after they complete their higher education. Students felt very happy interacting with the professor and asked many doubts which were clarified. NSS Co-Ordinator of kakatiya university Dr.Eesam Narayana has visited the camp and appreciated the volunteers' about the various activities performed and filled more joy and spirit in the volunteers.

#### Day 6

#### Menstrual hygiene awareness program

Model school consists of many girls children of adolescent age. So our unit felt to organise a menstrual hygiene awareness program in the school. Menstrual cycle is very common to all the girl children belonging to adolescent age. If they don't maintain proper hygiene during that time it leads to severe health issue. Our Pharm D VI year student's prasanna pragna Divya has explained to the students about the proper hygienic conditions to be maintained and proper way of the disposal of the sanitary pads. Students asked many doubts which were clarified by volunteers. Students and volunteers also visited palle prakruthi vanam and cleaned the surroundings.

#### Day 7

#### Valedictory session at gram panchayat office

The valedictory session was organised at gram panchayat office. Sarpanch Praveen, Panchayat secretary madam, Research Director C.Veersham, Principal of the college Dr.S.Vasudeva Murthy, staff members, students and volunteers has participated in this session. Program officer T.Ashwin Kumar has explained the various programs conducted in the villages during the past 6 days like menstrual hygiene awareness program, carrier guidance to model school children, Swachh bharat, importance of hand wash,. I thanked all the volunteer and management for their co-operation without which this program would not be a successful. Sarpanch Praveen also appreciated the team of NSS unit of Jayamukhi College of pharmacy. He said that the programs conducted during the week days are very impressive and very helpful to the villagers. Principal Dr.S.Vasudeva Murthy said that the Team shall always be ready to provide services whenever they need them.
